

Life history - As a kid I was exposed to bikes by my older cousins coming to my father to get custom paint on their Triumph's and BSA's, which were not allowed to leave until I got to go pillion around the block. As a teenager I learnt to ride on a mates bike around a farm property. After a couple of weeks and no other responses I rang Ulysses HQ and purchased the members list and started ringing all the members I could and organised to have to have a meeting at Corrigan's Beach (26 people showed up) to see what interest there was in starting a branch. It was decided we would have a meeting at Narooma in a months time and in the mean time I wrote an article for the local freebee newspaper, which caused my phone to ring non stop for days.

We had the meeting at Narooma and the rest is now history.

A big thanks goes to all those who were there because you all helped create what is now a great Branch, a member who deserves a special mention is Keith Miller (our first Sec/ Treasurer and who unfortunately also has Ridden On), who was a great help with setting up the spreadsheets and the infrastructure that made my life a lot easier in those early days.

The best bike I have ridden/owned - is a hard one, I loved my Laverda Jota, Honda VFR, my ST1100 has probably been the most versatile, too many and not enough room but all my bikes have given me special memories except one, my Yamie 750 triple, it was a lemon.

REGO TUBES

You may already have read this about the rego tubes. They are becoming popular and are a much neater feature on the bike. Although much more expensive from \$25 to \$90 for those with alloy ends, they are more UV resistant and supposed to stay clear for many years without going brittle.

Dear Sir,

I was recently pulled over by a police officer on the Golden Highway and told that the Rego Tube, which contained my rego label, was illegal. I told him that, as far as I knew it was legal, to which he replied "Would you like me to write you a ticket for it?"

When I returned home I changed back to a plastic rego holder and then wrote away to the RTA enquiring about the legality of the Rego Tube. Please find enclosed a copy of their reply.

The letter from a Kerry Willis, Customer Relations Coordinator for the RTA, states, in part...

"I have contacted the Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA)'s registration policy section, and have been advised that a 'rego tube' as you described can be used to hold the registration label for your motorcycle."

I think it's a fair call that, if a product is on general sale, the manufacturer has had it passed by a relevant authority. I also think it's a fair call that police officers can't possibly know all regulations pertaining to the legality of various products and should make judgments based on fact, not their own opinions.


