In the meantime, I look forward to seeing you on one of our rides, Kindest regards, Suzanne.


QUARTERMASTERS REPORT

The bike is a KAWASAKI W3A - 650 Twin. Des purchased the bike direct from the factory at Akashi, Japan whilst visiting the factory as a Kawasaki, and other motorcycles dealer since 1967. Des paid 462,000 yen and this was with a 10% discount.

Des has been to numerous rallies but did not join the Ulysses Club until the 2002 Mt. Gambier AGM.

His first bike was a 125 cc BSA Bantam purchased by his dad so Des could ride the 28 miles to West Wyalong where he was training as an automotive engineer. When Des was a qualified mechanic he opened the first motorcycle dealership at Ungarie in 1967. He sold Triumph, Norton, Yamaha, Kawasaki, CZ, Moto Guzzi & Polaris ATVs, he also repaired electrical home appliances and TV tower antennae installations. The TV antennae installations is where he got his nickname of "DareDevilDes".

Business is almost non existent at Ungarie and Des is kept busy looking after his elderly mother 'Beryl' who is in her 90's.

We have been to visit Des at Ungarie a couple of years ago and had a great time. Lyell & Helen Jenkins also come from Ungarie and this is how Des is known to our Branch. Frank Hopkins
